

Attention Parents of Students attending Title I Schools:

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program designed to help students achieve proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards. The Title I instructional program at each building is designed in consultation with parents and district staff to meet the needs of students by using strategies based on scientifically based research and implemented parental involvement activities. If you would like more information on the Title I program in your child's school or parent involvement opportunities, please contact your building principal.

Under the federal law, No Child Left Behind, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher, including the following:

- If your child's school is making Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP);
- Your child's level of achievement;
- The qualifications of your child's teacher;
- If your child is being taught by a teacher who is not considered "highly qualified";
- The availability of school choice for eligible students attending a school identified as needing improvement;
- The qualifications of a paraprofessional that may be providing services to your child.

You may access this information by contacting the building principal of the school where your child attends or by contacting the district's office of Human Resources (937-499-1426).

What is Public School Choice (PSC)?

If your child attends a school that has been identified as needing improvement for two consecutive years or longer, you have the option to request to transfer to a school within the district not identified as needing improvement. Notification regarding the improvement status of your school is made available 14 days prior to the first day of school. Currently, the only building within Kettering City Schools offering Public School Choice is Oakview Elementary School.
