

Technology Integration

The use of technology is integrated into the curriculum program at all levels in the Kettering City School District. This integrated approach assures all learners of being successful. Teachers assess and assign technology based on a student's individual needs. Through on-going assessment, teachers can prescribe the best learning practice for all students.

In the elementary grades, the students have the opportunity to utilize technology in math, reading, writing, science and social studies. They use a program called Success Maker for remediation as well as enrichment. The program allows for student-teacher interaction, as well as independent work. A reading program called Reading Counts helps teachers find a student's instructional level for guided reading. Children also enjoy the Houghton Mifflin math program, which reinforces grade-level math skills. The classroom teacher has the ability to customize technology in the classroom to maximize learning. The traditional library has been transformed into a Multi-Media Learning Center (MMLC), where technology is infused into a child's educational environment.
