JOINT CITY / SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

The Board of Education of the Kettering City School District met in special joint session with the Kettering City Council in the lobby of Kettering Fairmont High School.

School Board President George Bayless brought the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

Hearing of the Public: No one addressed the Board or Council.

Topics of Discussion: Mr. Alexander, South Unit Principal, recognized 15 students from the Career Tech Center for their accomplishments. They will represent the district in upcoming regional and national competitions.

Mr. Mike Berning, Music Coordinator from Fairmont High School, spoke on the music program at Fairmont High School, the many classes/opportunities that are offered, how the band has grown in the past 5 years and the accomplishments of some of Fairmont's music graduates. Mr. Berning also noted Fairmont's commendation as one of the "Best Communities for Musical Education."

Mr. David DeLon, Secondary Curriculum Leader, spoke on new programming that will be instituted next year at the middle schools. Project Lead the Way (PLTW) specifically Gateway to Technology, is a program to infuse STEM education into the schools. Students will be able to apply what they are learning in math and science into real life projects.

Dr. Schoenlein, introduced Liz Jensen, Career Technology Coordinator at Fairmont.
